

PROVIDER REFERENCE CHECKLIST

Checking references of potential child care providers is an important step in your search for quality care. Talking with parents who are using or have used a provider in the past can help give you some valuable insight. Below are some questions to ask when making those reference check calls. Use a new sheet for each reference you call.

- 1) How long have you known/been using this provider?
- 2) How has the experience been for you? Your child?
- 3) What are this provider's strong points in terms of how he/she runs the business or cares for the children?
- 4) How well does he/she communicate with you? Does he/she share how the child's day went?
- 5) Does he/she encourage parents to stop in, any time to visit? Have you done this? Have you felt comfortable doing this?
- 6) What would you change/improve about this provider or how he/she cares for children?
- 7) How well does this provider handle emergencies/unforeseen events? (Ask for an example if they have one).
- 8) Does the provider encourage a team approach for raising your child?
- 9) Does your child seem happy there?
- 10) Why are you no longer using the provider (for families who have used him/her in the past)?
