The 2016 Primary Election Audit included the manual verification of 31 races across 500 ballots. A total of 3,701 ballot contests were audited.

Pursuant to Section 1-7-514, C.R.S., and Election Rule 11 the attached report provides guidance for completing the post-election audit.

The following information is to be used to resolve issues that arise from the selection of devices and races by the Secretary of State's office:

If a device was identified as being available for use but did not have any votes cast on it, please indicate the status as "NO VOTES" in the field for Device Count and Manual/Hand Count.

If backup equipment was selected for the audit, contact the Secretary of State's Office.

If a voter service and polling center scanner or DRE has votes on it, but any of the races selected for audit do not appear on the device, contact the Secretary of State's Office.

If a central count scanner has votes on it, but the races selected for audit do not appear in the ballots chosen by the canvass board, then the canvass board must continue to randomly select ballots until all races can be audited.

The report must be signed by the canvass board members and the designated election official. E-mail the completed and signed report to voting.systems@sos.state.co.us no later than 5:00 p.m. on July 11th, 2016.

2016 Boulder County General Election Post-Election Audit

Audit Process

Audit Preparation:

After the list of selected devices and races were provided by the State, the DRE was checked to verify if votes were cast on the selected devices and to confirm the applicable races appeared on the device. The selected device A0AB62 contained no votes and this was documented in the 2016 Primary Election Post-Election Audit report. Since only 3 ballots total were voted on DRE (two at one site and one at another) we duplicated these three ballots, from the V-VPAT, onto paper ballots and scanned them with the remaining 8th day cured ballots to guard voter anonymity. We stored the duplicated V-VPAT tapes with our other duplicated ballots.

The selected scanner (#ED302017) contained 3,133 cast votes and all 31 of the 31 selected races. In preparation for the selection of ballots by the Canvass board, we generated a list of the scanned batches which included the district styles contained within each batch. This information is necessary to confirm that the randomly selected batches cover all of the selected races during the selection process.

Selection Process for paper ballots:

For random selection, a column was added to the selection spreadsheet, containing a random number formula. The list was then grouped by district (HD10, HD33, HD13, HD 12 and All Others) and given range numbers (Figure 1). Two board members sat next to the operator as selections were recorded to verify proper capture of the random results. Without seeing the association, the other board members selected a number from the given range, and the batch associated with random number was selected for audit. Batches associated with the random number were then checked to confirm if they filled in needed races. If a batch was selected that only included styles already selected for audit, the batch was not included in the audit selection list and the process was repeated. This process continued until all applicable races were included in the audit. The selection processed covered all applicable races after 6 batch selections. These batches contained 406 Ballots. In order to reach the 500 ballots needed an additional batch was randomly selected by a Canvass board member and the remaining 94 ballots were pulled from that batch (batch ID 27).

Below is a list of batches randomly selected by the Canvass board and ballots pulled for audit (Figure 2). After selection was complete, the selected batches were sorted by district style and put in batches of about 50 ballots each. Each of these batches were audited.

Machine Counts:

Because only three ballots were cast on DRE, these votes were duplicated onto paper ballots and scanned with the 8th day cures.

Ballots were organized in batches of approximately 50 ballots, scanned into a new database in Ballot Now on the selected scanner (# ED302017). The scanned ballots were resolved for voter intent. The cast votes for each batch were written to an individual MBB and tabulated to create individual results reports for each batch. At the end of the process, all MBBs were read into Tally to create a combined results report for each batch. The table below lists Audit Batch, Scan Batch and Mobile Ballot Box (MBB) associations (Figure 3). A Results Comparison was created to total all races. These totals by race were recorded in the Results Comparison Worksheet.

Manual Verification:

Bi-partisan Audit teams were provided a batch of approximately 50 ballots and a Manual Verification Worksheet (MVW) to record their tally. After the teams verified that they had the correct number of ballots,

each team sorted and stacked the ballots by each contest on the MVW and recorded the votes for each race. To support creating an accurate tally, at each step of the sorting and stacking the team members traded stacks to verify the selections recorded. Once complete, a tally for each batch was submitted for comparison. The information was entered into the Results Comparison Worksheet, alongside the machine counts. A difference column highlighted any differences.

When a difference was identified, the MVW was checked to see if a math error was the cause. If a math error was not easily determined as the cause, the discrepant batch was sent out to a separate team for a second count on the applicable contest(s). When the recount was completed, the new count was compared to see if the discrepancy was resolved.

In the end no differences remained, and no additional research was required.

Results:

Of the 3,701 ballot contests verified, zero differences were found after recount of 6 discrepant contests in 5 batches.

We therefore conclude no additional escalation is warranted.

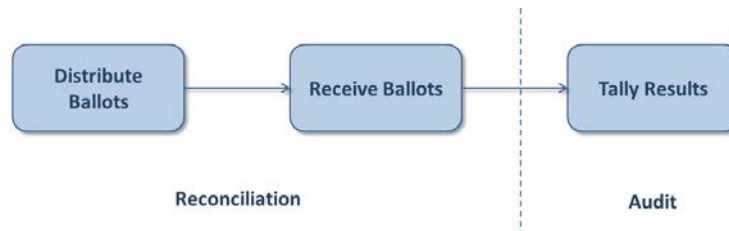
Boulder County 2016 Primary Election Reconciliation Report July 8, 2016

Overview

The primary duty of the Canvass Board is to ensure that the number of votes counted is equal to or less than number of ballots cast and that the number of ballots cast is equal to or less than the number of eligible voters (CRS 1-10-101.5). Secretary of State Rule 10 states that election details must be preserved, requiring tracking of issued ballots as well as voted ballots as they pass through the election processes.

It is from this foundation that we are able to reconcile the election. This report will present both summary data regarding the overall election processes, as well as a detailed accounting of ballots on a precinct-by-precinct basis. This report summarizes the processes that provide evidence to allow for the Canvass Board to fulfill their statutory duty.

A high-level view of the election processes can be seen below:

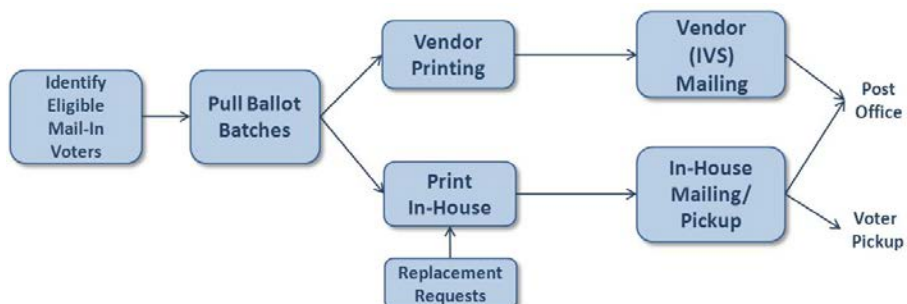


The reconciliation process primarily focuses on the distribution and reception of ballots through the assignment of voter credit. Boulder County's audit, the subject of a separate process and report, is the quality assurance procedure that checks the accuracy of the machine tally results. The audit and corresponding report assists the Canvass Board in their other duty, which is to certify the abstract of votes cast (election results).

Ballot Distribution

Mail Ballots

For primary elections, all ballots are automatically sent to all active eligible voters who are members of the parties participating in the primary election. Eligible voters are the subset of voters that are active, registered in the county, reside in one of the jurisdictions on the ballot, and are 18 years old or older on Election Day. Additionally, during primary elections, unaffiliated voters may affiliate with a party participating in the primary election up to and including election day and vote in that party's primary. The diagram below is an overview of the process of mailing ballots.



The Boulder County Elections Division uses a print/mailing vendor for a majority of the mail ballots sent. We provide the vendor with ballot images and addressing information several weeks before ballots are to be mailed. However, during these weeks we receive and process numerous registration changes, some of which void ballots being processed by the vendor. When possible we attempt to find and secure those voided ballots. For this election voids were pulled 2 times, securing 877 voided ballots and reducing the number of mail-pieces managed by the vendor. In addition, 191 ballots were pulled for the purposes of hand-delivery to Health Care Facilities (HCFs). The vendor hand-off to the Post Office reflects these numbers. Final totals show that ballots reported being mailed by the vendor matched our expected-to-be-mailed counts.

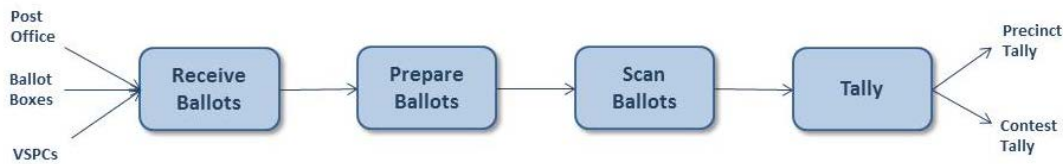
The majority of our mail ballots are printed and mailed through our vendor prior to the statutory deadline to mail ballots (no later than 18 days prior to the election). If a voter registers or changes their registration after lists and supplemental batches and voids are performed with our vendor, then that voter's ballot is printed in-house and taken directly to the local USPS facility to be mailed. This process of printing in-house and mailing ballots from our office continues until the statutory deadline of 8 days prior to the election. After that date, late registrants must visit a Voter Service and Polling Center (VSPC) to request a ballot.

During the course of the election, a total of 5,332 ballots were returned to the county by the USPS as undeliverable as of the date of this report.

Ballots Received

Mail ballots are received through the Post Office, secure 24-hour ballot drop boxes, drop-off ballot boxes from Voter Service and Polling Centers, or from drive-by drop-off locations. These ballots are validated by Election Workers and either accepted or rejected, depending upon the envelope signature, and recorded accordingly in SCORE. Letters are sent to the voters with a rejected signature (or missing signature or missing ID), allowing them to "cure" their ballot envelope by returning a signed affidavit and returning a copy of their ID (due by the 8th day after the election). Only the ballots associated with accepted envelopes proceed through the process to scanning, resolution, and tallying.

Voted paper ballots from Voter Service and Polling Center (VSPC) locations arrive in separate ballot boxes from the mail-in ballots. Because the voters were already recorded in SCORE and had their ID verified at a VSPC location, these ballots go directly to scanning, resolution, and tallying after being counted.



Attachment 2 provides an accounting of ballots received. The left hand portion of Attachment 2 shows the ballots received in SCORE by vote method.

As can be seen in the above table, two more ballots received vote credit in SCORE than were counted. One envelope contained a photocopied ballot inside its secrecy sleeve, which wasn't detected until after the extraction and separating process and therefore could not be associated back to an envelope. Photocopying of a ballot is prohibited by Statute 1-13-112 and thus the ballot was not counted. The other envelope contained a voter instruction sheet but no ballot inside its secrecy sleeve, also detected after the extraction and separating process, and again could not be associated back to the envelope and voter.

Attachment 2 pulls together all voting methods and provides a precinct-by-precinct comparison against the ballots seen by Tally.

Election Audit

The election audit confirms the ballots cast and the vote count. Randomly selected contests and randomly selected ballots are manually tallied and compared with the machine count of the same ballots. The Audit results are summarized in a separate report.

Statutory Requirement Fulfilled

Based on the research performed during this canvass and reported herein, it has been determined that Colorado Statute CRS 1-10-101 has been met, in that the number of votes counted is equal to or less than the number of ballots cast (accepted plus rejected ballots) and the ballots cast is equal to or less than the number of eligible voters.

** Ballots Cast includes ballots that are ultimately not counted due to various reasons. Most common reasons include: voter failed to sign the ballot envelope, voter failed to provide ID when required, or voter's signature did not match signature on file. Voters have until the 8th day after the election to rectify these issues, however, not every voter does so in this timeframe. If they do not, their cast ballot is not counted.*

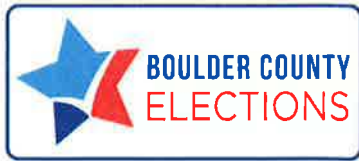

Final Official Results Available for 2016 Primary Election

Boulder County, Colo. – The final, official results from Boulder County's 2016 Primary Election are available now at www.BoulderCountyVotes.org.

The Elections Division added 1,501 additional ballots to the tally at the end of the 8-day period on Wednesday evening, July 6 for a total of 38,067 ballots counted. Democratic turnout for the primary election was 29.2% for active democratic voters. Republican turnout for the primary election was 33.6% of active republican voters.

The bulk of the 8-day updated tally included our reserve ballots, but it also included a small amount of ballots from overseas and military voters whose ballot was received after election day, but before the close of business on Wednesday as well as ballots from voters who needed to fix a signature discrepancy or were missing a signature on their ballot envelope among a few other categories of ballots that are processed after election day. (For more information on what types of ballots are processed at the end of the 8-day window, please see our [post-election day press release](#)).

The final official results include the Statement of Votes, a document that shows precinct-by-precinct results for every issue on Boulder County ballots for this primary election. The certified Statement of Votes has been forwarded to the Colorado Secretary of State's office to become part of the official statewide election record.

Last week, elections staff completed the 2016 Primary Election audit, a post-election quality assurance test that ensures the accuracy of the machine tally of votes. The audit used this year compared a manual tally of votes with the actual election-night machine tally of the same ballots. Any discrepancy was researched and resolved. A final report was issued to the Boulder County Canvass Board for verification prior to election certification.

Additionally, elections staff also completed the reconciliation process. This process provides the data, reports, and documentation for the Canvass Board to certify that the number of votes counted is equal to or less than the number of ballots cast and that the number of ballots cast is equal to or less than the number of eligible voters. The Reconciliation Report has also been posted online.

Despite the fact that there were no documented discrepancies found in the audit or reconciliation that impacted the outcome of any contest, the two Republican Party members of the Canvass Board declined to sign the documentation that the election was conducted accurately. This decision does not impact that the election results are now certified.

"I am extremely disappointed that the Republican Party members who chose to serve on the Canvass Board used their role to express political dissatisfaction with the Colorado election process and mail ballot elections," stated Hillary Hall, Boulder County Clerk and Recorder. "Boulder County Republicans, and the community at large, deserve better. They declined to sign the certification solely for political purposes outside of the scope of their role as Canvass Board members. Our election reconciliation and audit clearly show the election results are accurate, but they still declined to sign the documentation based off their overall concerns about mail ballot elections, which frankly have no merit either. The place to address their objections is with the state legislature and our law makers."

By Secretary of State Rule, if nothing found in the audit or reconciliation of the election impacts the outcome of the election, the results must be certified. There were no documented discrepancies found in the audit or the reconciliation that impacted the outcome of any contest.

The Boulder County Canvass Board reviewed the final audit and reconciliation election documents on Monday afternoon. This year's Canvass Board consisted of Boulder County Clerk and Recorder Hillary Hall, Maureen Denig and Cathy Jarrett representing the Republican Party, and Paul Geissler and Sally Martin representing the Democratic Party.
