

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## REGIONAL TRAILS

The trails of Carolyn Holmberg Preserve are part of a larger system of regional trails. The Rock Creek regional trail runs through the property. From this open space, you can connect to the Coal Creek Trail, Broomfield's Lake Link Trail and Josh's Pond.

- All connecting trails are multi-use, open to bicyclists, hikers and leashed dogs.
- The 12-mile Rock Creek Trail connects the Town of Erie to the Town of Superior. You can access this regional trail off the Mary Miller Trail, east of Stearns Lake. The Rock Creek Trail terminates at the Coalton Trailhead in Superior, and provides access to the City of Boulder's Greenbelt Plateau and Marshall Mesa Trailhead.
- The 14-mile Coal Creek Trail travels from Lafayette to Louisville. You can access this regional trail off the Rock Creek Trail, northeast of the Carolyn Holmberg Preserve.
- The 7.3-mile Lake Link Trail travels through Broomfield. You can access the trail off the Mary Miller Trail, east of Stearns Lake.
- Broomfield's Josh's Pond is located off the Cradleboard Trail, just south of the railroad.



Runners, walkers and bikers enjoy the regional trail system for recreation. Many people use it as a commuter route.

The trails are managed by Boulder County and local municipalities.
