

Dragonflies


Dragonflies are brightly colored insects that fly very fast, up, down, and even backwards! They catch their prey (other bugs) in mid-air and rest on top of long grasses and twigs. Watch a dragonfly fly around the pond. Why do you think dragonflies like to live near water?

Time's Fun When You're Havin' Flies!


Some pond creatures are good at hiding and can only be found when they make noise. Listen very closely, and you might hear the chirping of chorus frogs, or the croak and kerplunk of a bullfrog. Leopard frogs lay their eggs in spring, and soon after, tiny tadpoles hatch. Tiptoe quietly and you might find tadpoles swimming in the water next to the boardwalk 🖗.


If you find a frog, do not touch it! A frog's skin must stay moist to help it breathe. Touching frogs damages their slimy skin.

YOUR CASE: WALDEN PONDS

Walden Ponds is a wildlife refuge, which means it is a safe place for many turtles, frogs, fish, birds, and other animals. Walk along the shorelines of the ponds. You might see red-winged blackbirds, gulls, geese, ducks, and other birds that winter or breed here along with great blue heron, belted kingfishers, and white pelican.
