The goal of the Mobility for All (M4A) Program is to promote affordable multimodal (transit, bike, etc.) transportation options and to raise awareness that transportation is a basic social and economic need.

Mobility for All provides transportation assistance through a variety of programs, fosters collaboration between transportation and human service organizations, and conducts public education and outreach on the importance of transportation options.

ASK YOUR EMPLOYER

Reliable and affordable transportation is essential to stable employment. Here are a few tips that may help you secure affordable transportation to your workplace:

- Your employer might offer transportation benefits, such as the RTD Eco-pass or discounts on RTD passes.
- See if there is a van or carpool option available at work.
- If your workplace is 1 - 2 miles from a bus route you can easily combine bus and bike for a more affordable commute. See right page for affordable options.

B - Cycle Bike Share

B - cycle is a nonprofit bike-sharing program. Pick up a bike at any B-station for a short trip and return it to any station when you're done.



Bike then Ride Shelters

Instead of taking your bike everywhere; combine a bus trip and bike ride by using the shelter to complete the first or final mile of your commute.



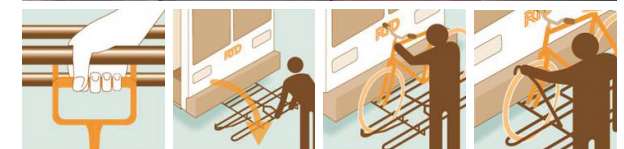
Earn - a - Bike
