


VOTER + VOTING STATS



Voter registration tends to peak after a presidential year and then decline as voters move and do not re-register until the next high-profile election. However, you can also see from the age breakdowns how the population of 25 and under registered voters has also grown significantly.

TURNOUT BY YEAR BY AGE**




FUN FACT


Did you know after every presidential year we have thousands of undeliverable mail ballots?

People tend to register in presidential years, then move and forget to update their registration. If you removed the 20K+ undeliverable ballots, 2017 turnout would be closer to 50%.


TURNOUT BY YEAR







HOW VOTERS RETURNED THEIR BALLOTS*

Includes voting in person and issuing mail ballots/replacements





Presidential Election vs. Coordinated Election








PROCRASTINATIONFUN FACT

In 2017, despite having half as many voters vote in the entire election, Boulder County Elections received more ballots on Election Day than we did in 2016 AND in 2017, we received over 1/3 of those in the last two hours of the election.

ACROSS THE WHOLE ELECTION, THE COURIERS:

- Made 248 STOPS to pick up mail ballots
- Made 57 ROUTE TRIPS
- Drove about 1714 MILES to collect mail ballots

ON ELECTION DAY THE COURIERS:

- Made 74 STOPS to pick up mail ballots
- Made 12 ROUTE TRIPS
- Drove 330 MILES to collect mail ballots
- Number of people contacted to work the election: 401

57 ROUTE TRIPS

- Number of Temporary Election judges and workers hired for the election: 173
- Number of people who work on Election Day: 167


An additional action email was sent to Inactive voters to encourage them to re-register if still in Colorado or to register in their new state and to withdraw their Colorado registration.
