



Official Notice of the Coordinated Election: Boulder County, Colorado



Election Day – Tuesday, November 5, 2019
Voting begins October 14
COORDINATED ELECTION INFORMATION

Under Colorado law, a mail ballot will automatically be sent to all active Colorado voters. Boulder County must also open Voter Service and Polling Centers (Voter Service Centers or VSPCs, for short) to provide in-person services for voters.

Voters have three options for returning their ballot: mail, 24-hour drop box, or VSPC. Ballots must be returned by 7 p.m. on Election Day (Tuesday, November 5). Ballots received after 7 p.m. on Election Day will not be counted. Postmarks do not count as a received date. If you are returning your ballot by mail, it is recommended you mail no later than October 29, 2019.

If you make a mistake, damage or lose your ballot, you may request a replacement ballot by emailing Vote@BoulderCountyVotes.org, calling 303-413-7740, or by visiting a Voter Service and Polling Center. The last day to request a replacement ballot be mailed to you is Monday, October 28. After such date, a voter must visit a Voter Service Center to request a ballot in person.

Voters can sign-up to receive text, email, or voice messages when your ballot is printed, mailed, and received by Boulder County Elections by enrolling in Ballot Track on our website: www.BoulderCountyVotes.org. This is a free service.

If you need to register or update your voter registration, please visit www.GoVoteColorado.com. Additionally, Boulder County Elections recommends all voters review their information to ensure the information on their voter registration record is correct.
