



Official Notice of the Presidential Primary Election: Boulder County, Colorado



Election Day – Tuesday, March 3, 2020
Ballots mailed beginning February 10, 2020

PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION INFORMATION

Elections in Colorado are conducted by mail ballot with Voter Service and Polling Centers (VSPCs) available for those who would like additional assistance or prefer to vote in-person. See below for a list of locations and hours/days of operation.

For this Primary Election, ballots will be mailed beginning the week of February 10, 2020. Presidential primaries in Colorado are only held by the Democratic and Republican Parties. You must be registered as a Democrat, Republican, or Unaffiliated voter to participate.

Party affiliated voters: All active, eligible voters who are members of either the Republican or Democratic parties will be mailed their respective party's ballot.

Unaffiliated voters: Unaffiliated voters who have not pre-selected their ballot preference (deadline to pre-pick a ballot preference was Feb 3, 2020) will receive a mail ballot packet containing both a Democratic and Republican Party ballot. **Unaffiliated voters may only vote and return only one ballot** (if both ballots are voted and returned, neither ballot will be counted).

Voters have three options for returning their ballot: mail, 24-hour drop box, or VSPC. Ballots must be returned by 7 p.m. on Election Day (Tuesday, March 3). Ballots received after 7 p.m. on Election Day will not be counted. Postmarks do not count as a received date. If mailing your ballot, it is recommended to mail it no later than Monday, February 24, 2020.

Voters can sign-up to receive text, email, or voice messages when their ballot is printed, mailed, and received by Boulder County Elections by enrolling in Ballot Track on our website: www.BoulderCountyVotes.org. This is a free service.

While Colorado does not have a voter registration deadline (you can register and vote up to and including Election Day), February 3 was the last day for voters who are affiliated with a political party to change or withdraw their affiliation if they wished to vote in a different party's presidential primary election.

If you make a mistake, damage or lose your ballot, you may request a replacement ballot by emailing Vote@BoulderCountyVotes.org, calling 303-413-7740, or by visiting a Voter Service and Polling Center.
