# Reduce Your Use of Pesticides by Attracting Beneficial Bugs

# Ladybugs



**Diet** 

Aphids, mites, and many other smaller bugs

#### **Attractants**

Plants with shallow nectar access (dill, coriander, or alyssum)

# **Spiders**



**Diet** 

Many types of insects including ants, flies, moths, and the eggs of mites and fleas

### **Attractants**

Crumbs of food (which may attract the insects they prefer to eat)

Dark, cool, undisturbed places with safe hiding

## **Ground Beetles**



**Diet** 

Aphids, slugs, and soft insect larvae

#### **Attractants**

Safe hiding spaces during the day since they are nocturnal (large rocks, cement crevices, logs, grass, etc.)

# **Aphids**



## **Diet**

Sap from a large variety of plants

## **Deterrent Strategies**

A strong water spray from a garden hose

A hoop house or row cover over the plants

Attract ladybugs (see other side)

# **Boxelder Bugs**



## **Diet**

Seed pods of female boxelder trees

## **Deterrent Strategies**

Replace boxelder trees with another species

Use a hose vacuum to move them outside

Seal cracks and holes in your house

## Moths



### Diet

Organic fibers such as wool, silk, cotton, linen, fur, and hair are only eaten in the larval stage

## **Deterrent Strategies**

Store clothes with dried lavender, rosemary, mint, or thyme sachets

Install bat houses

Wash clothes before storing them in a dry place

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
