

VAPE DEVICES ARE HAZARDOUS WASTE

E-liquid can leak into the ground causing hazardous chemicals to enter the environment.





Cartridges and pods cannot be recycled and should not be disposed of in trash bins.



Vape batteries can start fires.

SIMPLE STEPS FOR SAFE STORAGE & HANDLING

- Keep devices and liquid out of harm's reach when not in use. Make sure tops are secure.
- Keep loose batteries in a case to prevent contact with metal objects.
- If devices are leaking place in a sealable plastic bag.
- Call the Rocky Mountain Poison and Drug Center at (800)-222-1222 if a child or pet swallows e-liquid or chews on a cartridge.
