General Information Onsite Wastewater Treatment System (OWTS) is a broad term referring to any system for the collection, storage,
treatment, neutralization, or stabilization of sewage and wastewater that occurs on the property. A septic system is a type of OWTS, consisting of a septic tank that collects all the sewage and a leach field for final treatment by the soil.
OWTS are used to treat and dispose of relatively small volumes of wastewater, usually from houses that are not a part of or connected to a sewage treatment works.
What <u>not</u> to flush: ☑ Diapers
➤ Paper towels
Example 10 Feminine hygiene products
What not to put down the drain:
Cooking oil, grease, and other fats
Cigarette butts
Coffee grounds
Meats and other food waste (garbage disposals should be used sparingly)
Excessive amounts of drain solvents or other household chemicals
Keep vehicles and other heavy equipment away from the absorption field.
