

# ADDENDUM #1 Public Works Morton Heights Paving, Drainage & Sidewalk Improvements BID # 7309-22

A revision was made to the project special **Traffic Control Plan – General** to include information about the contractor being allowed to work with a full closure of Walker Road between Niwot Road and Morton Road. The revised project special is attached with the new language added in red text.

An Excel version of the bid tab is being posted with Addendum #1 as an alternative method for bidders to submit bids. (There are no changes to the original bid tab.)

#### TRAFFIC CONTROL PLAN - GENERAL

The key elements of the Contractor's method of handling traffic (MHT) are outlined in subsection 630.10(a).

The components of the TCP for this project are included in the following:

- (a) Subsection 104.04 and Section 630 of the specifications,
- (b) Standard Plan S-630-1, Traffic Controls for Highway Construction and Standard Plan S-630-2,
- (c) Schedule of Construction Traffic Control Devices,
- (d) Signing Plans,
- (e) Construction phasing details,
- (f) Detour Details,
- (g) Manual of Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), and
- (h) Other.

Unless otherwise approved by the Engineer, the Contractor's equipment shall follow normal and legal traffic movements. The Contractor's ingress and egress of the work area shall be accomplished with as little disruption to traffic as possible. Traffic control devices shall be removed by picking up the devices in a reverse sequence to that used for installation. This may require moving backwards through the work zone. When located behind barrier or at other locations shown on approved traffic control plans, equipment may operate in a direction opposite to adjacent traffic.

Unless road closures are approved, Special Traffic Control Plan requirements for this project are as follows:

- (a) A full closure of Walker Avenue between Niwot Road and Morton Road may will be permitted for this project, but it must be reopened on or before August 12, 2022.
- (b) During the construction of this project, traffic shall use the present traveled roadway unless identified on the plans or approved by the Engineer.
- (c) The Contractor shall not have construction equipment or materials in the lanes open to traffic at any time, unless approved by the Engineer.
- (d) During the resurfacing work, only one lane may be closed to traffic at any time unless approved by the Engineer. Traffic shall not be delayed for more than 15 minutes or as directed by the Engineer.
- (e) The Contractor shall not perform any work requiring lane closure on the roadway between the hours of 8:30 and 9:30 a.m. and between 3:30 and 4:30 p.m. or as directed. This only applies if work goes past the school's opening deadline (August 17, 2022).

## -2-TRAFFIC CONTROL PLAN – GENERAL

- (f) The Contractor shall submit to the County Traffic Engineer a method of handling vehicular traffic (MHT) for approval at least 10 working days prior to each construction phase, prior to changes in traffic control and or prior to start of any construction. Contractor shall obtain any necessary permits required from other agencies.
- (g) Access to residents' and properties shall always be maintained.
- (h) At least one week prior to starting construction, the Contractor shall notify the Engineer of the date the Contractor intends to start construction.

All costs incidental to the foregoing requirements shall be included in the original contract prices for the project.
