









### ON ELECTION DAY, THE COURIERS:

Made 100 STOPS to pick up mail ballots

### ACROSS THE ENTIRE ELECTION, THE COURIERS:

Made **540 STOPS** to pick up mail ballots

Made 77 ROUTE TRIPS

Drove about 2,496 MILES to collect mail ballots




