
#### NOTE WORTHY UPDATES FOR JANUARY 2023

- United States Interagency Council on Homelessness (USICH) released the new 5-year strategic plan to address homelessness.
- Partners across the county are actively working on their proposals in response to Transformational Homelessness Response (HB 22-1377/HB 22-1304).

#### OVERVIEW OF DATA IN BRIEFING


- Overall, the number of Coordinated Entry screenings were higher in both October and November which
  reflected an overall increase compared to the same time frame in the prior year (2021).
  - City of Boulder was up 10% annually and saw an increase of 23% in October and 17% increase in November 2022.
  - City of Longmont was up 12% annually and saw an increase of 39% in October and 47% increase in November 2022.
- 313 individuals have exited homelessness between January 1, 2022, through November 31, 2022 (an overall increase of 13% compared to the same timeframe as last year).
  - o City of Boulder seen an increase of 3% in all exit avenues:
    - Housed- 1% increase
    - Reunification-15% increase
    - Other- 25% increase
  - o City of Longmont seen an increase of 23% in all exit avenues:
    - Housed- 17% increase
    - Reunification- 28% increase
    - Other- 33% increase
    - Housing exits through HMIS data system reflected a 21% increase in 2022.
- On average, 28 individuals exit homelessness per month for calendar year 2022:
  - o 19 to housing
  - o 9 through reunification
  - o Less than one to other programming such as treatment.




# COORDINATED ENTRY ASSESSMENT RESULTS PER LOCATION

#### CITY OF LONGMONT<sup>1</sup>




# HOUSING OUTCOMES


The following data and charts reflect individuals experiencing homelessness who have exited the homeless services system to a stable housing outcome. It is important to note that the data reflected in the following charts reflect Housing Outcomes via system entry and exit are not the same individuals.

#### SYSTEM ENTRY/EXIT JANUARY 2023

Since January 2022, 31% (313) exited homelessness into a stable housing situation.

#### HOUSING OUTCOMES FISCAL YEAR BY COORDINATED ENTRY INITIATED SITE 2022

As reflected, a total of 313 individuals experiencing homelessness exited homelessness since January 2022 with 137 (44%) from the City of Boulder, 64 (20%) from the City of Longmont and 112 (36%) Boulder County<sup>3</sup>.




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#### HOUSING OUTCOME BY EXIT TYPE CITY OF BOULDER 2022

Since January 2022, in the City of Boulder, a total 137 individuals have exited homelessness with 72 (53%) individuals exited to housing, 61 (45%) through Reunification, and 4 (3%) through providing rental assistance (reflected in Other) to remain in housing.




#### HOUSING OUTCOME BY EXIT TYPE CITY OF LONGMONT 2022

Since January 2022, in the City of Longmont, a total 64 individuals have exited homelessness with 36 (56%) individuals exited to housing, 25 (39%) through Reunification, and 3 (5%) through Other program.



#### HOUSING OUTCOME BY EXIT TYPE BOULDER COUNTY 2022

Since January 2022, through the OneHome HMIS data system and in Boulder County, a total 112 individuals have exited homelessness with 99 (88%) individuals exited to housing, and 13 (12%) through Reunification.




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


# COORDINATED ENTRY ASSESSMENT RESULTS PER LOCATION

#### **Discussion Items**

### Review of County and Cities' BHA and DOLA grant applications

**Boulder County:** 

Behavioral Health Administration:

SB 22-196: Criminal Justice Early intervention program - requesting services to expand Tribe Recovery Homes. Will help to do some preventive work with those experience homelessness or continuing the cycle through the jail.

HB 22-1281: Community Investment Grant Program - will complement existing funds for expansion of Tribe Recovery Home services.

#### Department of Local Affairs:

HB 22-1377: Transformational Homeless Response - coordinating with non-profits to avoid duplication of efforts, grant application includes additional county staff, a Forensic Assertive Community Treatment team, street outreach, and bridge housing funding.

Noted award of \$50,000 from MacArthur to be used for application and administration, landlord assurance fund, and additional minute cards for phones.

#### City of Boulder

Department of Local Affairs:

HB 22-137: \$8M letter of intent – \$5M to support the Day Center for operational cost & furnishings and \$3M to support respite services.

HB 22-1304: \$6-7M for homelessness prevention; working with Boulder County Criminal Justice System around Bridge Housing for high utilizers.

City of Longmont will not be applying but will work with the County's request for funding.

Metro Denver Homeless Initiative will apply for funds to:

- Build capacity to do more meetings for regional coordination, Built for Zero work and developing best practices
- Support for Diversity, Equity, Inclusion (DEI) work to create a racially equitable system
- Support for housing stability fund
- Support statewide growth of the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) support

Discussion around clients served and staffing.

Next steps: Follow up discussion with Boulder Shelter for the Homeless about their hours.

#### • Update on migrant shelter planning efforts

Focus is on supporting Denver infrastructure and shelter. Boulder County and City of Boulder asking staff to volunteer/work at shelters in Denver.

#### Navigation Services Center and 24/7 Shelter facility

City of Boulder released Request for Proposals (RFP) in early December, RFP closes this month (January). Once a service provider is selected will be working with them to find a location.

### Meth policy review activity / Meth-related housing issues and implications

Boulder County Public Health, Human & Housing Services, Boulder County Housing Authority and Community Services are currently reviewing the policy and legislation around remediation. Will look at policy draft in March and will move toward making recommendations.

Boulder Housing Partners is looking at tightening screening criteria. Noted impacts on who they house and the neighbors in the community.

#### • Summer Point in Time count

City of Boulders City Council has requested a Summer Point-in-Time count.

Next steps: Come up with methodology, cost and bring that recommendation to the board.
