# Strawberries and Kale

Strawberries and kale are June's fruits and veggies of the month. Kale may be en vogue now, but people have been growing this super food for more than

than 2,000 years. Kale is packed with antioxidants (substances that can prevent or slow cell damage) and some research suggests that regularly eating kale and other vegetables in the cabbage family (collard greens, Brussels sprouts, etc.) helps lower the risk of certain cancers. Like kale, strawberries are popular amongst Americans. On average, each American eats 3.4 pounds of fresh strawberries each year plus another 1.8 pounds frozen. Strawberries are not only sweet, they're also good for you too. One cup of strawberries contains more than 100% of the recommended daily amount of Vitamin C and contains only 55 calories.
