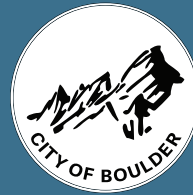


What's different about the November 2023 election?



The City of Boulder will conduct Ranked Choice Voting (RCV) for the first time to elect its Mayor.



Candidates may only run for Mayor or for City Council, not both.



How to complete a ranked choice contest:

	1 st Choice
	Select one
Candidate A	<input type="radio"/> 1
Candidate B	<input checked="" type="radio"/> 1
Candidate C	<input type="radio"/> 1
Candidate D	<input type="radio"/> 1

2 nd Choice
If any, must be different from your 1 st choice
<input checked="" type="radio"/> 2
<input type="radio"/> 2
<input type="radio"/> 2
<input type="radio"/> 2

3 rd Choice
If any, must be different from your 1 st and 2 nd choices
<input type="radio"/> 3
<input type="radio"/> 3
<input type="radio"/> 3
<input checked="" type="radio"/> 3

STEP 1: Choose your top candidate. This is your 1st choice candidate and will be the vote that is considered first.

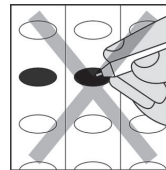
STEP 2: If you have a 2nd choice (not required), you may select another candidate. This must be different from your 1st choice candidate.

STEP 3: If you have a 3rd choice (not required), you may choose another selection. This must be different from your 1st and 2nd choices. Continue marking your choices for as many candidates as you prefer for as many choices allowed on the ballot.

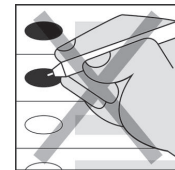
HOW VOTES ARE COUNTED:

All 1st choice votes are counted. If no candidate has the required number of votes to win, candidates that have the fewest votes are eliminated. This process continues until a candidate has enough votes to win. Election officials only use your 2nd or 3rd choice if your 1st choice has already been eliminated.

BALLOT ERRORS:



Do not choose the same candidate more than once.



Do not choose more than one candidate in the same column.
