Press Release – Sentence Imposed in Stranger Sexual Assault

On July 5, 2021, Boulder Police received a 911 call in the early morning hours with an open line. Police responded to the area of the 911 call using emergency locate technology to locate the involved parties. The victim informed police that she had been working on-call by herself when she saw a man sitting outside. She interacted with the male on two occasions and told him he needed to leave. The woman later checked all the doors and went to sleep. Around 3:00 am, she woke to banging noises in the workplace's kitchen. The male proceeded to beat and rape her, causing serious bodily injury. The woman fought courageously throughout the attack and was eventually able to free herself and run away. Officers arrested Randy Raygor leaving the building shortly after contacting the victim.

The case went to trial. On December 21, 2023, the jury found the defendant guilty of all counts to include Sexual Assault (F2), Sexual Assault (F3), Second Degree Assault (F3), Burglary (F3) and two Crimes of Violence sentencing enhancing counts. Under the law, Mr. Raygor is subject to indeterminate sentencing. Today, the Judge sentenced Randy Raygor to 40 years to life on count one, 12 years to life on count two, 32 years on count three, and 10 years on count 4. Counts 1-3 all merge and will run concurrently, **count one and count four will run consecutively for a total of 50 years-to-Life.**

First Assistant District Attorney Ken Kupfner and Chief Trial Deputy District Attorney Catrina Weigel stated, "We cannot say enough about the strength and tenacity of the victim in this case, it was an honor to work with her. We believe the sentence imposed today will protect the community."

District Attorney Michael Dougherty stated, "The victim survived a horrifying attack by this defendant. This lengthy prison sentence is certainly the right outcome, based on this defendant's terrifying conduct. I want to acknowledge and thank the prosecution team for their hard work and commitment to justice, as well as the jurors for their service."
