Current Situation

- The Local Improvement District (LID) was created in 2008 to fund original system with loans.
- The LID must dissolve once loans are paid off in 2025.
- LID can not be used for operations.
- The budget for 2024 is estimated for \$133,000. Total operating budget + loan repayment currently exceeds revenue. The budget is supplemented by the existing fund balance until the LID dissolves and a new revenue structure is decided.
- Quarterly billing will remain the same (for now) while the property assessment will go away when the LID dissolves.

Public Q&A

- Is this a county-wide election? No, however Boulder County is still looking into who are eligible electors (Property owners, residents, etc)
- Would the county Commissioners continue to be the Board under a PID? Yes
- If a LID is not meant for operations, why wasn't a PID created at the start of the WWTF? The legal question of operations under a LID wasn't fully answered at the time this district was formed. New case law clarified this question.
- Are we unable to do more metropolitan district services due to EASi owning the roads? - There are many more services available besides road maintenance such as mosquito control.
- Is there any difference in taxing authority with a PID and Special District? They are similar but we will look further into the differences.
- In the sale to a private entity, who gets the money? The money would go to the county.
- What happens to the rules and regulations in a new district? New rules & regs
 would be adopted in a new district, by default we would continue to use the LID
 rules & regs.
- What happens to the district boundary? Once the district dissolves, the boundary
 would technically dissolve with it. This is why it is important to make a new
 district before that. By default the county would run the district as is when the LID
 dissolves but with the creation of a new district inclusions or exclusions of certain
 properties can be discussed.
- Are there other PIDs in the county? Yes, recently (2018) a Niwot subdivision (Burgundy Park) created a PID for road repaying.
- Are there title 32 districts in the county? Yes, fire districts/water districts etc.
- Is incorporation even legally feasible? Requires a certain number of electors. We would have to look into how many electors are in the town.
- If the County received an offer to buy the WWTF privately, what would the county say and would the community have any input? If the county got an unsolicited offer, we would have to make it available for anyone to make an offer and there would be a public process.
- Does the PID expire? No, the PID would have to be dissolved.

- How does the advisory board feel about these options? All members agreed that
 they are continuing to form an opinion but really want more community feedback
 before they make a choice. Several committee members expressed that currently
 the PID seems like their preferred choice.
- How will the easement for the plant access road be handled in the event of a private sale? Further research required
