

# Official Notice of the Statewide Primary Election Boulder County, Colorado



Election Day – Tuesday, June 25, 2024 Ballots mailed beginning June 3, 2024

#### STATEWIDE PRIMARY ELECTION INFORMATION

Elections in Colorado are conducted by mail ballot with Vote Centers (formally referred to as Voter Service and Polling Centers or VSPCs) available for those who would like additional assistance or prefer to vote in person. See below for a list of locations and hours/days of operation.

Ballots will be mailed beginning the week of June 3. You must be registered as a Democrat, Republican, or Unaffiliated voter to participate. **To register, update, or check your voter registration, visit www.GoVoteColorado.gov**.

**Party affiliated voters**: All active, eligible voters who are members of the Democratic or Republican parties will be mailed their respective party's ballot. No minor parties are holding a primary. The **deadline to change or withdraw party affiliation is Monday, June 3** – visit **www.GoVoteColorado.gov** to update your registration.

**Unaffiliated voters**: By law, unaffiliated voters will be mailed a ballot packet containing both a Democratic and Republican Party ballot, but the voter can only vote in and return one. **If both ballots are voted and returned, neither ballot will be counted.** 

**Voters have three options for returning their ballot**: mail, 24-hour drop box, or Vote Center. Ballots must be returned by 7 p.m. on Election Day (Tuesday, June 25). Ballots received after 7 p.m. on Election Day will not be counted. Postmarks do not count. If mailing your ballot, it is recommended to mail it no later than Monday, June 17 (earlier is better).

Voters can sign-up to receive text, email, or voice messages when their ballot is printed, mailed, and received by Boulder County Elections by enrolling in BallotTrax on our website: <a href="https://www.BoulderCountyVotes.gov">www.BoulderCountyVotes.gov</a>. This is a free service.

There is no voter registration deadline in Colorado but for primary elections, as noted above, there is a party affiliation deadline for existing registrants. If eligible and a new voter in Colorado, you can register and vote up to and including Election Day. However, if you would like to receive a ballot in the mail, the last day to register or change your registration mailing address is Monday, June 17. After this date, if eligible, you can still register, including online, but you must visit a Vote Center in person to request a ballot or use our Ballot-to-Go service.

If you make a mistake, damage, or lose your ballot, you may request a replacement ballot by emailing Vote@BoulderCounty.gov, by calling 303-413-7740, by visiting a Vote Center, or by using our Ballot-to-Go service.



Vote Centers (Voter Service and Polling Centers) – Services include:

- Vote in person
- Request to vote in Spanish
- Request a replacement ballot
- Drop off your ballot
- Register to vote or update your registration information
- Vote using equipment and facilities for persons with disabilities
- Fix a signature discrepancy or missing signature issue



**Ballot-to-Go** – Replacement ballots brought to your car (CU is walk-up only). Available at all Vote Centers this election. Call **720-440-7886** to order your ballot during Vote Center hours beginning Monday, June 17. This service ends at 5 p.m. on Election Day.
