

Deliverable: Host a community engagement through the design process to inform the strategic plan for BCDHS


Sessions we scheduled for 90 minutes.

Participants created small groups of 8 to 12 people.

Each group engaged the essential services of DHS. We asked them to reflect on what could be better about the services and why/does does "better" matter for their future in Boulder County.

Today we want to highlight:



 - Gendered dynamics are compounded by race, ethnicity, language, and immigration status





Community Engagement Demographics

An overview of the demographic information Integrated Work gathered for Boulder County DHS during the first round of 2024 community engagements for the five-year Strategic Plan.

We had a total of 89 total participants. 58 shared demographic information









Caretaking services predominantly fall on women.



Caretaking impacts educational and employment opportunities significantly



Attendees also attribute the burden of ensuring food security and healthcare to women in caretaking roles.



High-Level Data

Demographic Information

We asked participants to share their demographic information during the event using an anonymous form using a phone or laptop computer. The demographic information we asked for:

- What Racial Category do you most identify with (American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian, Black/African American, Mixed Race, Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, White/Caucasian, Not Listed, Prefer Not to Answer)
 Do you Identify as Hispanic or LatinX
- What Gender Category do you most closely identify with (Male, Female, Non-Binary, Transgender Male, Transgender Female, Agender, Two-Spirit, Not Listed)
- Please Share your Zip Code
- Are you Currently Employed (Yes/No)
 What is your individual income per year (Less, than 10K, 10-14.9K, 15-24.9K, 25-34.9K --- 200K or more)
 Age (18-24, 25-34, 35-44, 45-54 -- 100 years or older)
 Are you currently a care-giver for someone (Yes/No Conditional to age ranges Under 18, 18-64, 65 or older)




During community engagement efforts, women constituted a significant 81% of attendees, and reflected a central role in shaping the discourse around critical human services.

Boulder county, according to US Census data is 50% Male

Intersectionality: Race and Ethnicity

The role of women in human services is further impacted by the intersection of race and ethnicity.


For instance, 43% of participants identified as Hispanic and about 27% identified as a race other than white.

This highlights the diverse cultural contexts in which services are delivered. These intersections show the need for culturally competent approaches that acknowledge and respect varying needs and experiences.

(US census data: Boulder County is 14% Hispanic and 75% white.)

In 2022, Boulder, CO had a population of 329k people with a median age of 37 and a median household income of \$99,770. Between 2021 and 2022 the population of Boulder, CO declined from 328,713 to 328,658, a -0.0167% decrease and its median household income grew from \$92,466 to \$99,770, a 7.9% increase.

The population of Boulder below the federal poverty line is approximately 12.3%

High-Level Data

Data Overview

We have a high-level overview of the demographic information gathered for Boulder County Department of Human Services from the community meetings for the strategic planning process.

There were 200 potential opportunities for participation from the community.

177 number of people signed up and were assigned to a meeting time, with another 36 who wanted to participate but couldn't make out assigned times.

89 total participants, 58 participants shared demographic information
