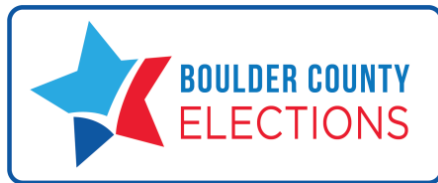

October 7 10am-5pm

If needed, the LAT will continue October 8th at 10am.

Purpose of LAT (CRS 1-7-509 and SOS Election Rule 11)

The purpose of the LAT is to test the compatibility of the election ballots through the scanning and tabulation equipment to confirm that every voting position on the ballot is accurately counted where a properly marked selection is made.

Testing Board member responsibilities

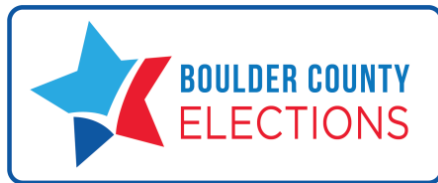
- You will be participating in all parts of the LAT, ensuring all requirements are met.
- You will attest to this at the end of the process and document the successful completion of testing.
- No process shall be delayed due to the absence of a Testing Board member.

Guidelines for Observers at the Logic and Accuracy Test

- The LAT shall be open to representatives of the political parties, the press, and the public to the extent allowable and pursuant to section (CRS 1-7-509(2)(b)). The designated election official may limit the number of representatives from each group because of space limitations. (Rule 11.3.2(b)).
- Each major political party, minor political party, ballot issue committee that has an issue on the ballot, and coordinating entity may designate one person, who shall be allowed to witness all public tests and the counting of pretest votes. (CRS 1-7-509(2)(b))
- If an observer or designee hinders or disturbs the test process, the designated election official may remove the person from the test area. An observer or designee who has been removed from a public test may be barred from future tests. (CRS 1-7-509(2)(b))
- The absence of observers or designees shall not delay or stop the public test. (CRS 1-7-509(2)(b))
- The election official will provide name tags and badges to all participants and observers. Participants and observers are required to sign-in to enter our ballot processing area. A copy of the LAT Information Packet will be available for observers.
- The Logic & Accuracy Testing will take substantially all the Elections staff time and resources today. Therefore, any questions should be directed to Stephanie Gnoza, Elections Director, or her designee.

The following items are prohibited in the scan room

- Personal belongings
- Cameras or other recording devices
- Memory devices
- Laptops
- Food and beverages



Acronyms and Definitions

Adjudication: Refers to both the process of reviewing a ballot manually to determine tabulation decisions, and to the DVS application which facilitates the adjudication process.

BMD: Ballot Marking Device, an electronic device which allows a voter to mark a ballot through any combination of touchscreen, audio output, and accessible devices. BMDs print a voter-verifiable ballot, which is scanned and tabulated the same way as a hand-marked paper ballot.

CTD: County Test Deck, a prepared deck of ballots comprised of all ballot types, with some ballots from each print source that will be used in the election, and with all choices marked for each contest including undervotes and overvotes. There is a calculated, expected tally with a different result for each choice per contest to verify the accurate tabulation of each choice.

DVS: Dominion Voting Systems, the voting system used at Boulder County.

ICC: ImageCast Central, a type of tabulator specific to DVS. Can refer to both the tabulator stations (located in the Scan Room) and the application on the computers which facilitates ballot scanning and tabulation.

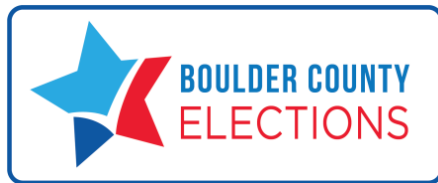
ICX: ImageCast X, the DVS BMDs.

RTR: Results Tally and Reporting is the DVS Application which combines all tabulated results after adjudication and generates voting reports.

Tabulator Station: A combination of the scanner, computer, and application which scans ballots and counts (tabulates) the votes on the ballots.

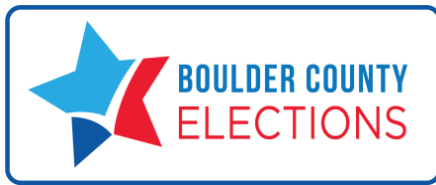
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Order of Events

1. Introduction and Overview
2. Each Test Board selects a Ballot Marking Device (BMD) for testing
3. Test Board verifies all seals on equipment, and verifies no ballots have been tabulated
4. Each Test Board selects a tabulator station for testing
5. Ballot marking and tally sheet
 - Each Test Board member is provided 25 test ballots
 - Test Boards mark ballots and calculate expected results with a tally sheet
6. County Test Deck scanning begins, and Board's tally sheets and ballots are reviewed for accuracy
 - Boulder County staff inspects ballots for improper markings, and verifies correct tally
 - Testing Board makes any needed corrections prior to voting BMD ballots
7. BMD Test
 - Vote 25 ballots on the BMD, duplicating the test deck from steps 3 and 4, as possible
 - o The BMDs will not allow overvotes, overvotes will be marked as undervotes instead
 - While voting using the BMD, Board members will also test each of the following:
 - o Audio ballot playback and accessible input devices
 - o Spanish language option
8. Lunch at approximately 12:30, will continue BMD voting on return if not completed
9. County Test Deck results created, Board's BMD tally sheets and ballots reviewed for accuracy
10. Scan and Tabulation Test
 - Scan hand-marked and BMD ballots to the tabulator stations selected in step 4
 - Ballots are adjudicated as needed
 - Individual tabulation results are created for: the County Test Deck, each Board's hand-marked ballots, and each Board's BMD ballots
 - A cumulative tabulation result of all the above will also be created
11. Compare Tabulation Results to Expected Tallies
 - All the tabulation results from step 10 will be compared to expected tallies
 - If there are discrepancies, the physical ballots will be reviewed
12. Completion of testing
 - Review test information and results
13. Resetting and sealing of equipment
 - Reset and seal BMD equipment
 - Reset Scan Stations
 - Reset Results Tally and Reporting (RTR)
14. LAT Board signs off on testing completion, and all LAT material and ballots are stored securely



- Complete Statement of Qualification

Requirements of the LAT

Preparation:

- The Testing Board is comprised of one registered elector from each major political party.
- The Testing Board members are registered in Boulder County and have been sworn in as election judges.
- Each type of voting device and each type of ballot will be represented in testing.
 - The county has prepared a test deck that includes every ballot style and precinct in the election.
 - The county test deck includes ballots printed from each model of ballot-on-demand printer that will be used in the upcoming election, and commercially printed ballots.
 - Each Testing Board will be provided 25 test ballots which are clearly marked “TEST.”
- The county test deck includes a mark for every vote position for every candidate, overvotes, and undervotes for each contest. It also includes write-in candidates when applicable.
- The Board’s test ballots will be marked using the instructions printed on the ballot.
- Testing Board will create and retain a record of the tally on a tally sheet.
- An appropriate number of devices will be made available for the test.

BMD Test (Ballot Marking Device):

Testing Board members will:

- Use at least one BMD to mark and print 25 ballots in the same manner the Testing Board member manually marked their test ballots (except for overvotes),
- Mark at least one ballot using audio ballot playback and accessible input device, and
- Mark at least one ballot using Spanish.

Scanner Test (Ballot counting device):

Testing Board members will:

- Verify the zero-report generated in the Results, Tally, and Reporting (RTR) Application, and
- Observe the separate counting of the County Test Deck and Testing Board’s test ballots on at least one scanner.

Tabulation:

Testing Board members will:

- Verify the zero-report generated from RTR before tabulating, and
- Observe the separate tabulation and result report generation of all test ballots.

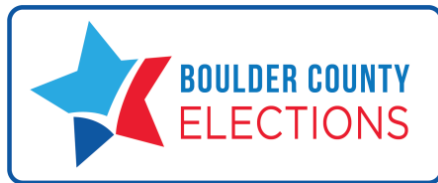
Comparison:

Testing Board members will:

- Verify that the results reports exactly match the Testing Board’s predetermined tally of votes, and
- Verify that the county test deck results report exactly corresponds to the county’s predetermined tally of the votes, and
- Observe the investigation into, and sign off on the finding behind any discrepancy.

Storage of test materials:

- All test materials must be secured in a sealed metal cage if the Test Board leaves the building.



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- Each Testing Board member will verify the seals and initial the chain-of-custody log.
- If records are opened for inspection, at least two election officials will verify the newly attached seals and initial the chain-of-custody log.

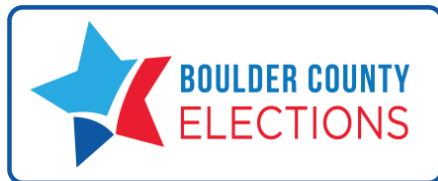
Completing the test:

- Test result files will be exported for Election Night Reporting and Risk Limiting Audit purposes.
- The county will back up the election project containing all test results, including cast vote record files.
- Testing Board and Clerk will verify the documented seal number attached to each voting device.
- Testing Board will observe the county reset and seal each voting device, as applicable.

Statement of Qualification:

Testing Board and Clerk will sign a written statement attesting to:

- The qualification of each device successfully tested,
- The number of the seal attached to the voting device at the end of the test,
- If applicable, any problems discovered, and
- Any other documentation necessary to provide a full and accurate account of the condition of a given device.



LAT Testing Board Procedures

Ballot Marking

The county has provided a packet of test ballots to each Testing Board member that includes 25 unique precinct-district style ballots. This is in addition to the ballots prepared to fulfill the county test deck requirements.

1. Confirm the number of ballots, verify they are all labeled “TEST.”
2. Number each ballot at the top, 1 through 25.
3. Use the following instructions for marking ballots while creating the tally sheet. Do not start marking your ballots until you have read through the tally sheet instructions and have your tally sheets prepared as this is a team activity.
 - When marking your ballots, follow the “instructions for voting” printed on the ballot.
 - ✓ Use the pen provided and fill in the oval completely; no X or V.
 - ✓ Voting for more than the maximum number of allowed choices is considered an Overvote.
 - ✓ Voting for less than the maximum number of allowed choices is considered an Undervote.

- How to correct a mistake:

NOTE: Ballots that are damaged or improperly marked will be reviewed and/or rejected prior to the scanner portion of testing. Catching and correcting a mistake immediately prevents delays in testing later.

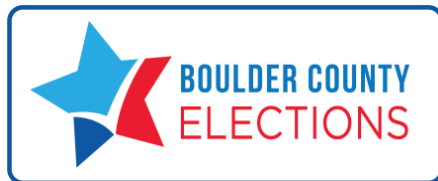

CHOICE A	 (Fill in the oval to the right of your choice)
CHOICE B	 (Draw a line through the choice you did not mean to choose)

- If a mistake (wrong choice, stray mark, hesitant mark) is made, request a replacement ballot from staff.
- Write-In votes: For this election **there are no Certified Write-In candidates**
 - ✓ A certified write-in candidate name shall be noted on the Tally sheet.
 - ✓ Uncertified candidates are counted as an undervote if no other choice is marked.
 - ✓ A write-in vote will be counted if you:
 - Completely fill in the oval provided to the right of the words “Write-in”
 - Write at least the last name of the certified candidate.
 - a. For the Presidential contest the last name of both President and Vice President must be written in.
 - Do not vote for more than the maximum number of allowed choices.
 - A list of certified write-in candidates will be provided for reference, if applicable.

Creating the tally

Testing Board members are to use the provided tally sheet to track the markings made on their ballots. On each sheet of the tally sheet, follow this procedure to create a tally for your test ballots:

1. Print both participant names on the first page of your tally sheet and initial subsequent pages.
 - This document will be available to the public so please do not add your signature.
2. Person A reads aloud each contest name, marks the contest selection made, then reads aloud their mark.



3. Person B will record the selections read aloud by Person A on the tally sheet for the appropriate contest option read and will make notation of any abnormal markings as indicated.
 - If a contest has not been voted, the appropriate number of “Undervotes” must be recorded for that contest. For example, if a contest allows up to 3 votes, and only 1 vote was recorded, there are 2 undervotes.
 - If more choices are made than the contest allows, be sure to mark the “Overvote” row.
 - If a contest does not appear on a specific ballot style, make no tally mark for that contest in the tally sheet column associated with that contest.
4. Add up the selections for each contest option and record this number in the applicable “Total” field.
5. After verification has been completed, notify election support staff.
6. Election support staff will review the Tally sheet and ballot markings for accuracy.

County Test Deck on Scanners

The county is required to prepare a test deck of ballots that includes every ballot style and, where applicable, precinct. The county test deck must include enough ballots to:

- Mark every vote position for every contest, including write-in candidates
- Allow for situations where a contest permits an elector to vote for two or more positions
- Include overvotes and undervotes for each contest where applicable
- Includes a sufficient number of ballots so that each vote position in each contest receives a unique, known vote total for that contest

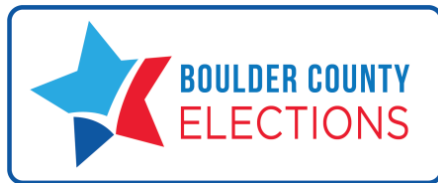
In addition to the packets provided to the Testing Board, the county has prepared a deck and tally that meets the above requirement.

As is required for the Testing Board ballots, the county ballots are counted on one or more scanners, adjudicated, and then tabulated for comparison against the county tally. Results are then generated and provided to the testing board, where the testing board then verifies that the results exactly match the pre-determined tally.

BMD Test (Ballot Marking Device)

The Ballot Marking Device (BMD) visually displays or audibly presents ballots and allows voters to print a paper ballot. A BMD also provides voting accessibility to voters who may be otherwise unable to mark a paper ballot privately and independently. It includes an audio ballot playback feature with headphones and can accept adaptive devices for voters with mobility impairments.

1. Record which BMD you are testing in the upper right-hand corner of the tally sheet.
2. Bring your test ballots to the selected BMD where you will:
 - Mark and print all 25 test ballots on the BMD in the same manner you manually marked the test ballots.
 - Confirm that the ballot style, contests, and selections on the BMD review screen match the paper ballot prior to printing
 - i. A contest cannot be overvoted on an BMD, so any hand-marked overvotes shall instead be voted as a blank/unvoted contest on the BMD.
 - Verify that the ballot style, contests, and selections printed from the BMD match the paper ballot (overvotes reflecting as a blank contest).
 - Validate the BMD audio and screen content for at least one manually marked test ballot.
3. Mark a ballot using the audio ballot playback and accessible input device:



- Person A will listen to audio instruction and uses accessible input device (paddles) to make ballot selections.
 - Person B will verify that the BMD selection made matches the manually marked ballot selection.
4. Before printing the ballot, verify that the ballot style, and choices displayed on the BMD Review Screen match the manually marked ballot selections.
 5. Once printed, verify the ballot style, and selections of the BMD printed ballot, attesting that the BMD ballot matches the manually marked test ballot.
 6. In the upper right-hand corner of the BMD ballot, write in the ballot number that coincides with the manually marked ballot used for testing (1, 2, 3).
 7. Staff will check the BMD ballots to ensure they match the hand-marked ballots, and that the tally sheets match.

Scanner Test (Mail and In-Person paper ballot counting device)

An ICC scan station is designed to capture an image of a voter's paper ballot, process the image of that ballot, and capture the voter's choices.

This test ensures properly marked choices are being accurately captured and recorded; we want to make sure that a choice for Candidate A is being recorded as a vote for Candidate A, and not Candidate B and that there is compatibility between the ballots (proper printing and alignment), and the equipment.

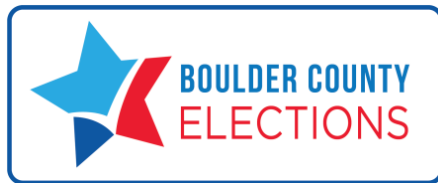
An adjudication station provides for the resolution of voter intent as prescribed by the Colorado Secretary of State. Ballots which are blank, have overvoted contests, or have write-ins will be automatically flagged by the voting system and adjudicated per state guidelines.

1. Before the start of any scanner testing, the Testing Board will verify the zero report on RTR, confirm that the Total Ballots Accepted on the scan screen on each ICC is zero, and verify that there are no batches listed in the Batch Reporting section of the ICC Status screen.
2. Testing Board ballots (manually marked and BMD marked) are brought to the selected ICC scan station. Record the ICC station ID in the upper right-hand corner of your tally sheet and check that the Batch Size on the scan screen is zero.
3. Testing Board ballots are then processed on the scanner and votes captured.
 - Each set of test ballots are scanned in and saved, to capture and process ballot images.
 - Scan count is validated by the Test Board.
 - Applicable ballots are adjudicated if needed, following state rule and guidelines.

Scanner results tabulated and verified

The RTR application tabulates vote records to produce combined election results. This process confirms that votes are accurately tabulated and aggregated by the scanner and tabulation system.

1. Before starting the scanner test, the RTR Election Summary Report showing "0" votes cast is presented to the Testing Board for verification that the system has been set to zero. They also verify that no batch results have been received in RTR.
 - Both team members initial and date the report, documenting that it has been verified.
2. After tabulation, reports will be generated for the tabulation of the Testing Board's ballots.
 - A separate Election Summary Report is generated for hand-marked and BMD-marked ballots.



3. The Test Boards will compare the results report to their team tally sheet, validating that the tabulated results exactly correspond to the team's predetermined tally of the manually marked and BMD marked test ballots.
4. When the team concludes the counts to be accurate, both team members initial and date the results report, attesting to the accuracy of the count and the machine.

Discrepancy resolution (in order of escalation)

1. Review for tally errors:
 - Review tally sheet for too few or too many votes captured.
 - Review ballots with tally sheet for incorrect recording and recount if needed.
 - Review Adjudication and Audit Marks for resolution differences (if applicable).
 - Review comparison and recount if needed.
2. If error is identified as a hardware or software error on single device:
 - Validate other tested equipment was not impacted.
 - Mark device unsatisfactory, replace and test alternative/new device.
3. If error is identified on more than one device and devices are failing in similar fashion:
 - Test multiple devices that could reasonably have same error.
 - Mark devices unsatisfactory, replace and test alternative/new devices.
 - If enough resources are not available for replacement, error shall be corrected, and retesting will be completed.
4. If error is identified as a software or ballot programming error:
 - Alert staff for correction.
 - Correct software or ballot programming error and restart testing from beginning.

Reporting and back up

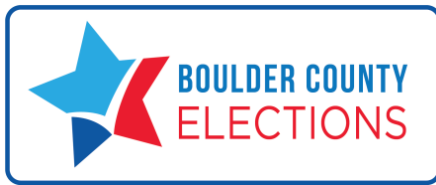
When all individual results have been verified, the county will generate a Cumulative Election Summary Report that includes all tested ballots. The reports will be reviewed with the Testing Board at the end of the LAT.

1. All team tally sheets and machine count data is entered onto the Cumulative Results Comparison spreadsheet.
2. A cumulative Election Summary Report is generated, and total ballot count verified.
3. Election results files are exported to fulfill Election Night Reporting requirements, and the test election data is backed up.
4. Cumulative result information is entered and validated in the Cumulative Results Comparison spreadsheet.
5. Cumulative result is reviewed by Test Board and if correct, initialed, and dated.
6. Testing documentation is collected and organized.

Resetting and sealing of equipment

After testing, the Testing Board must watch the county reset and seal each voting device, as applicable. As part of the Statement of Qualification, the Testing Board and Clerk must attest to the seal number attached to the voting device at the end of testing.

1. Testing Board witnesses the resetting and sealing of the BMD equipment, verifying the seal numbers attached to each device.
2. Testing Board witnesses the resetting of scan stations and Results Tally and Reporting, verifying that the Total Ballots Accepted on the ICCs is "0" and that the Election Summary Report is regenerated and shows "0" votes cast.



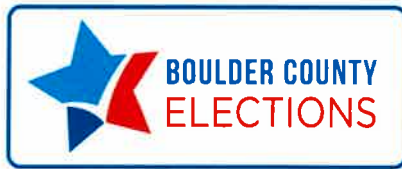
Completion of Testing

After the devices are reset and sealed, all tabulation results are reviewed with the Clerk and Testing Board, along with testing documentation. The Testing Board and the county clerk must sign a written statement attesting to the qualification of each device successfully tested, the number of the seal attached to the voting device at the end of the test, any problems discovered, and any other documentation necessary to provide a full and accurate account of the condition of a given device.

1. Test information and results are reviewed with the Clerk and Testing Board.
2. Cumulative results are verified by the Testing Board.
3. Testing Board and Clerk complete the Statement of Qualification.

Secure storage of all LAT materials and ballots

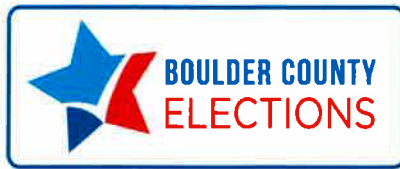
The county must keep all test materials, when not in use, in a durable, secure box. Each member of the Testing Board must verify the seals and initial the chain-of-custody log maintained by the county clerk. If the records are opened for inspection, at least two election officials must verify the seals and initial the chain-of-custody log.

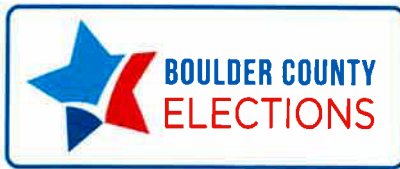
