






Registered Voters by County and State




Registered Voters in Boulder County by Year


The percentage of all Colorado voters living in Boulder County has remained relatively steady as overall population has grown - around 6%


Registered Voters by Party








Voter Turnout by Location




Voter Turnout by Year

Coordinated Election years immediately following a Presidential Election




Voter Turnout by Party



Did you know?

In Boulder County, we use ballots counted to calculate turnout. Ballots cast may better reflect attempted turnout, but that number includes ballots that could not be counted, usually due to signature issues. Also, the number of ballots cast is not always easy for the public to find.




Vote Center Usage by Year


The largest ballot haul returned was from the Louisville Rec Center - 1427 ballots at once!

Did you know?

We hire fewer temporary employees for Coordinated Elections than for General Elections. However, in off-year elections, many voters wait until Election Day to return their ballots. Because so many ballots come in at once, we still need about the same number of people working in Ballot Processing on Election Day.



Student judges were hired for behind-the-scenes Ballot Processing roles. They also traveled with courier teams to pick up ballots.



At Your Service

Our Ballot Processing team works to ensure that every eligible ballot is counted **quickly and accurately**, while keeping voters informed if their ballot envelope signature is accepted or needs to be cured.

The Elections Division aims to process **90%** of all ballots by the end of Election Day. In 2025, the team exceeded that goal, processing **91%** of ballots by day's end and notifying voters of their ballot status.

Curing what ails a Ballot

In Colorado, we verify you are who you say you are by the signature on your ballot envelope. When our Signature Verification team can't match signatures we have on file to what's on your envelope, you have to "cure," or fix, the issue.

1503 Ballots required curing this election
542 Ballots were cured and counted



Forget something?

As much as we want every vote to count, sometimes envelopes come in that we can't process.

This year, we received a ballot from **2018** and **12** voters returned **empty** envelopes!

394 ballots were received after 7 p.m. on Election Day and couldn't be counted.


Dog eat your ballot?

This year we received a badly damaged envelope with a note that read "My dog ate my ballot!" Happily, the damage wasn't too bad and we were able to verify and count it!

We also had a request for replacement ballots due to a "pumpkin explosion." The unruly pumpkin took out two ballots!

Health Care Facilities Outreach

Bipartisan judges visit health care facilities (HCFs) without secure mail rooms to deliver ballots and assist residents in voting. We continue to refine our HCF process to provide helpful services to this often overlooked population.

Did you know?



Ballot Processing Center Tours



Voter Email Program


Boulder County Elections sends a series of emails to voters in the weeks leading up to Election Day. These emails include helpful information about the election plus important deadlines.

BallotTrax is a free service that sends notifications when your mail ballot has been sent to you and then received by Boulder County Elections.


