



Official Notice of the Statewide Primary Election Boulder County, Colorado



Election Day – Tuesday, June 30, 2026
Ballots mailed beginning June 8, 2026

STATEWIDE PRIMARY ELECTION INFORMATION

Elections in Colorado are conducted by mail ballot with Vote Centers available for those who would like additional assistance or prefer to vote in person. See below for a list of locations and hours/days of operation.

Ballots will be mailed beginning the week of June 8. You must be registered as a Democrat, Libertarian, Republican, Unity, or Unaffiliated voter to participate. **To register, update, or check your voter registration, visit [GoVoteColorado.gov](https://www.govotecolorado.gov).**

Party affiliated voters: All active, eligible voters who are members of the Democratic, Libertarian, Republican, or Unity Parties will be mailed their respective party's ballot. In Boulder County, no other parties are holding a primary election. The **deadline to change or withdraw party affiliation is Monday, June 8** – visit [GoVoteColorado.gov](https://www.govotecolorado.gov) to update your registration.

Unaffiliated voters: By law, unaffiliated voters will be mailed both major party ballots (Democratic and Republican). The voter may choose to vote and return only one of these ballots, or if an unaffiliated voter wants to vote in either the Libertarian or Unity Party primary, these are the options:

- The **Libertarian Party** has chosen to conduct a closed primary which means a voter must be registered as a Libertarian to participate in their primary. If an unaffiliated voter wants to vote in the Libertarian Primary, they must change their party affiliation by June 22 to be mailed a ballot. They may also change their party affiliation in person through Election Day and vote in the Libertarian Primary.
- The **Unity Party** has chosen a semi-open primary allowing unaffiliated voters to participate without changing their unaffiliated status. If an unaffiliated voter would like to vote in the Unity Party primary, the voter may:
 - Update their registration and affiliate with the Unity Party by June 22 to receive the ballot in the mail.
 - Remain unaffiliated and call or visit our office to request a Unity Party mail ballot.
 - Remain unaffiliated and visit a Vote Center starting June 22 through Election Day to request a Unity Party ballot.

Important: No matter which party primary a voter chooses, they may only vote and return one party's ballot. If a voter marks and returns more than one ballot, none of their votes will be counted.

Voters have three options for returning their ballot: by mail, 24-hour drop box, or Vote Center. Ballots must be received by 7 p.m. on Election Day (Tuesday, June 30). Ballots received after 7 p.m. on Election Day will not be counted. Postmarks do not count. If mailing your ballot, it is recommended to mail it no later than Monday, June 22.

Voters can sign-up to receive text, email, or voice messages when their ballot is mailed and received by Boulder County Elections by enrolling in BallotTrax on our website: [BoulderCountyVotes.gov](https://www.bouldercountyvotes.gov). This is a free service.

There is no voter registration deadline in Colorado but for primary elections, as noted above, there is a party affiliation deadline for existing registrants. If eligible and a new voter in Colorado, you can register and vote up to and including Election Day. However, if you would like to receive a ballot in the mail, the last day to register or change your registration mailing address is Monday, June 22. After this date, if eligible, you can still register, including online, but you must visit a Vote Center in person to request a ballot.

If you need to register or update your voter registration, please visit [GoVoteColorado.gov](https://www.govotecolorado.gov). Boulder County Elections recommends all voters periodically review their information to ensure the information on their voter registration record is correct.

If you make a mistake, damage, or lose your ballot, you may request a replacement ballot by emailing Vote@BoulderCounty.gov, by calling 303-413-7740, or by visiting a Vote Center.
